## Rights affected by forces life

- Article 2 non discrimination
- Article 9 Separation from parents and maintaining contact
- Article 16 to be protected from arbitrary or unlawful interference with their privacy, family home or correspondence
- Article 3 best interests
- Article 18 parental and family support
- Article 24 highest attainable health
- Article 28 & 29 right to education and goals of education
- Article 27 access to suitable housing
- Article 12 respect for the views of the child
- Articles 13 & 17 provide the parameters for how children should be supported to ensure that they can meaningfully form a view, including access to information.
- Articles 15 & 31 support children's right to participate in wider society through freedom of association, play, recreation and cultural activities.
- >> Key to the right to participation is access to justice when rights are breached.
- Article 42 Governments must make sure children and adults know their rights.
