

# UNDERSTANDING THE LANGUAGE (TRI-SERVICE)

Barracks/station/unit	Place where Armed Forces workers live/work			
Posted/drafted/ assigned	Told that you have to move location			
Deployed/detached	Working for periods of time away from home either on training active service or on other duties			
Weekending/ dispersed	When a parent works away from home during the week and comes home only at the weekends. The family may well not live near to a station/barracks/unit.			
R and R	A period of leave to enable the serving person to 'rest and recuperate'			
POTL or POL	Post Operational Leave straight after returning home from a deployment. May lead to requests for mid-term absence.			
Quarters / SFA / patch	Living accommodation or Service Family Accommodation			
I/C	In charge			
Commanding Officer or CO BFPO	The officer responsible for all of those under their command and by extension their families.  British Forces Post Office - A postal address for members of the armed			
	forces and their families based overseas.			



### ARMY-SPECIFIC TERMINOLOGY



AFF	Army Families Federation. AFF is independent from the Army and is there to support families in all aspects of life affected by an Army lifestyle.			
AWS	Army Welfare Service. The Army's professional welfare support service, providing confidential support.			
Assignment order/posting order	The formal instruction given to the serving member of the family to change role, often instigating a move.			
Unit Move	When a whole unit moves from one station to another.			
Regiment, Battalion, Company, Platoon	Organisational terms to describe common structures within the Army.			
Pad Brat/Military Brat	A child whose parent is in the Armed Forces. It has no negative connotations and is title many children and their families use with pride.			
Squaddies	A colloquial term for a Private soldier in the Army.			
UWO	Unit Welfare Officer

SBS	Special Boat Service (Royal Navy's special forces)			
Boat	Submarine			
Ship	Surface warship			
Familygram	A one-way only 120 word message from a family to a submarine			
Carrier	Aircraft carrier			
Fleet Air Arm	Aviation branch of the Royal Navy			
Base port	One of the 3 Naval Bases (Clyde, Devonport and Portsmouth) from which warships and submarines operate			



## ROYAL AIR FORCE-SPECIFIC TERMINOLOGY



RAFA	Royal Air Force Association – charity offering a range of welfare support to RAF personnel, veterans and their families as well as funding activities on stations, including KidZone nurseries.			
RAF Benevolent Fund/'Ben Fund'	Charity offering support to RAF stations, personnel, veterans and families including Airplay and counselling (including youth counselling). Offer targetted financial assistance.			
Airplay	A specific youth group run on RAF stations.			
CDO	Community Development Officer – staff member on a unit or station with responsibility for youth activities and community engagement. Good point of contact for education providers.			
RAF Community Support	The part of the RAF that is responsible for coordinating and providing support to families.			
RAF Families Federation	The RAF Families Federation provides all RAF personnel and their families – Regular and Reserve, single or married –support, assistance and an independent voice regarding issues or concerns that they may have.			
SSAFA Support workers	Specific SSAFA staff contracted to provides support to RAF personnel and families.			
RAF HIVE	Information service for RAF personnel and families. There is an office with a Hive Information officer on most units/stations.			
Station Commander	The person who is head of the Unit/Station			
Wing/Squadron/Flight	Organisational terms to describe common structures within the RAF			
Aircrew	Personnel who fly in planes (as opposed to those who are ground based).
